- Open Forge Forges, anvils, vises, and a wide range of tools available for use at most meetings.
- Iron In The Hat (IITH)
  - O Attendees to meetings bring items to donate to the Iron In The Hat drawing. Tickets can be purchased for \$1 each or \$20 for 25 tickets. Bring a hand-forged item(s) and get 5 free tickets. Each item has a cup, if you want a chance to win that item, put one of your tickets in the cup. A ticket is drawn, and if it is yours, then you win that item.
